CALL FOR SUBMISSION OF PROPOSALS FOR COMMON SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNOLOGICAL PROJECTS ON COOPERATIONS BETWEEN INSTITUTIONS OF THE SLOVAK REPUBLIC AND THE REPUBLIC OF SLOVENIA IN YEARS 2008 AND 2010

1. LEGAL FRAME

Based on the Agreement between the Government of the Slovak Republic and the Government of the Republic of Slovenia on Cultural, Technological, Educational and Scientific Cooperation, signed on November 13, 2001 in Bratislava, the Slovak Research and Development Agency (APVV) in cooperation with the Division of Science and Technology of the Ministry of Education of the Slovak Republic opens a Call for submitting proposals for common scientific and technological projects between collaborating organizations in the Slovak Republic and the Republic of Slovenia.

2. THEMATIC FIELDS

This Call does not define any priority resarch areas. On the basis of common RTD activities the proposals from any RTD field can be submitted with duration of two project years (i.e. 24 months). Cooperating partners from RTD organizations with common objectives and complementary skills are invited to submit joint proposal. The projects will be implemented by means of exchange of scientists and information.

3. ELIGIBLE PROPOSERS

Project proposals can be submitted by any legal or physical body in science and technology in the Slovak Republic within all research and development sectors (universities, enterpreneurs, governmental, non-profit) that is involved in an agreed research program by means of existing supported projects. At least one partner within the proposal must be from Slovenia.

4. CALL DURATION AND SUBMISSION OF PROPOSAL

The Call was opened on **January 15, 2008**, the deadline being **March 15, 2008**. Applications must be submitted in electronic form using on-line system in <u>Slovak and English language</u> with deadline 15.3.2008 until 13.00. An original signed form should be delivered to the Agency at the latest by 18.00 on **March 15, 2008**, or sent by mail to the address Slovak Research and Development Agency (APVV), Mýtna 23, P.O.Box 346, 814 99 Bratislava with post stamp date latest March 15.

After this deadline it is impossible to submit proposals. The proposal must be signed by all participating organizations (signatures of responsible project leaders, statutaries and stamps). Signatures and stamps of Slovenian partners sent by fax will be accepted.

5. START AND TERMINATION OF THE PROJECT

The projects submitted in the frame of this Call can start at the earliest on July 1, 2008, and must be completed on June, 30, 2010.

6. FINANCING

The financial support offered within this call is strictly limited to <u>mobility</u> (travelling costs and daily subsistence allowances). The involved organizations must be able to demonstrate that they have the other necessary resources to carry out the project (a grant, institutional resources, commercial funding, etc.). The numbers of grants and the way of financing should be declared in box "Actual ensured financial resources".

It is possible to plan short-time stays maximum 2x14 days/project year (it means duration of 12 months) or long-time stay maximum 1x15 till 30 days/project year.

The Slovak party provides:

- travel expenses up to the level of return plane ticket price economy class - to Slovenia for Slovak employees/experts of research and development
- health insurance of Slovak experts during their stay in Slovenia
- daily allowances for Slovenian experts in Slovakia in accord with the Slovak law on reimbursement of travel expenses (Art. 283/2002)
- accommodation for Slovenian experts in Slovakia maximum 28 nigths/project year in case of short-time stays or in case of long-time stay 15 till 30 nights/project year (max. 2000,-Sk/night)
- travel expenses, daily allowances and accommodation for Slovak employees/experts of research and development which accompanied Slovenian experts in Slovakia

Similarly, the Slovenia party will cover travel and insurance for Slovenian experts coming to Slovakia. Further, daily allowances for Slovak experts during their stay in the Slovenia will be provided.

Finances will be provided in accordance with the approved budget of the Ministry of Education of the Slovak Republic by the Slovak Research and Development Agency (APVV) for project duration. The expenses in Slovak Republic will be provided in accord with approved budget for bilateral scientific and technological cooperation for years 2008 an 2010.

7. EVALUATION

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The selection of projects has two stages. In the first stage the proposals will be treated separately by national committees, the second round will be done by the International Joint Committee.

At national level the proposals will be evaluated using the following criteria:

- Scientific and application targets (60 points)
 - Added value in given RD sector 10 points)
 - Originality at national and international level (10 points)
 - Quality of presentation and targets (10 points)
 - Reasons for cooperation (10 points)
 - Appropriateness and emergency of proposed methods (10 points)
 - Potential socio-economic and scientific contribution (10 points)
- II. Expertise of proposer and organization (20 points)
 - Professionality (15 points)
 - Infrastructure (5 points)

Maximum points: 80

The evaluation in Joint Committee will be done under these conditions:

- Single party proposal will be not evaluated
- Proposal with high ranking from both parties will have priority as compared to contraversial ones
- Discrepances will be discussed having in mind mutual interest

Evaluation results and final list of financed projects will be announced after Joint Committee meeting.

8. RULES FOR PROPOSERS

Each project must have one responsible person from Slovak and Slovenian participating organisations. The proposal must be submitted parallel by the leading Slovak partner in Slovakia and the leading Slovenia partner in the Slovenia. The responsible persons submit forms filled in Slovak and English or Slovenian and English, respectively. The proposals must involve the title, list of all participants, duration and specific goals. Further, the timetable and finacial requirements distributed in chapters and years, brief CV's of Slovak participants, list of Slovenian participants and clear arguments for international cooperation should be present. If the projects is linked to already existing cooperation, the responsible proposer should mention the anticipated results and their added value for Slovakia.

9. OBLIGATIONS OF THE PROPOSER

The statutary of the Slovak organization will sign a contract for financial support with the Slovak Research and Development Agency. At the end of each calendar year the responsible person reports to the Agency. The report must include a statement of progress with the project and cost statements relating to the claimed travel and subsistence expenses for the period in question. After the project is terminated the responsible person must provide a final report to the Agency.
